



Joint project - the way into the <2° economy

The project that "Stiftung 2°" has implemented together with WWF Deutschland, numerous companies and with funding by the Federal Ministry for the Environment, is based on the conviction that a <2° economy is feasible and that companies play a key role. DRÄXLMAIER took part in the thematic cluster dealing with traffic. In this project, DRÄXLMAIER worked actively with other companies on the issue of "2° Logistics", which is a project to exchange best practice cases in corporate transport logistics. The aim of the project is to create an online platform that compiles climate-friendly, userfriendly transport concepts.



Liquified Natural Gas-operated truck crosses the Alps for DRÄXLMAIER


One method of coordinating the logistics processes in a more sustainable way lies in the use of environmentallyfriendly fuels. The DRÄXLMAIER Group uses the socalled LNG truck (Liquified Natural Gas) as standard equipment – so far for transports in Northern Italy. Another milestone has now been reached on the route from the plant in Tunisia to Vilsbiburg. A new LNG service station in South Tyrol enables trucks to cross the Brenner, thus making it possible to cover the distance between Genoa and Livorno in Italy and Vilsbiburg.

Part sections are covered via so-called "Rolling highways" (RoLa), meaning that the LNG truck and the trailer are transported by rail – which is currently a unique combination in transportation. Combining road and rail has a whole series of advantages. Emissions, for example, can be further reduced by operating the railway line with hydropower.





Tunisia: Management sets an example

Together with volunteers, the Management in Sousse collects waste along a main road and then plants trees and bushes.
